Oct 26th Poker Run Steve Johnson discussed the poker run that will begin at 11:00am, meet at the Starbucks near the Target construction zone. This will be approximately two hours, and Steve is planning on taking us on corvette-friendly scenic roads. This will be a different poker run compared to the Anniversary run in that it is based on a scavenger hunt, but you can increase your odds of winning by purchasing more hands, each hand \$5.00.

Nov 11th Veterans' Ceremony, Grass Valley Veteran's Hall Cap Wallington is encouraging us all to attend this year's annual Veteran's ceremony. He plans to be wearing his dress whites, and hopes that other veterans will join him in this recognition of service. Parking is available, but Cap suggests getting there early for better parking. The ceremony begins at 10:00 and ends promptly at 11:00am. Again, 11-11-11, November 11th and ends at 11:00am.

Nov 16th Planning meeting for 2022-2023 Steve Johnson will be the chairman for our annual planning committee, to be held during our regular November meeting. It is critical that members come with ideas of places to go or what you would like to do. For example, where did the club go before that you really enjoyed?
